Approximately 3 Million people in the world are colorblind, which impacts the way interact with the world. This community relies on designers creating color palettes that provide contrast. Contrast allows visual elements to be communicated clearly to viewers who are colorblind, and helps provide an inclusive visual experience. Use this card when creating color palettes to ensure that the colors have contrast and can be seen by any viewer.
